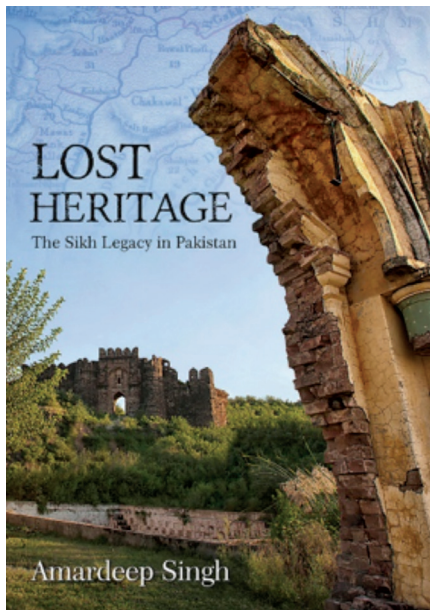

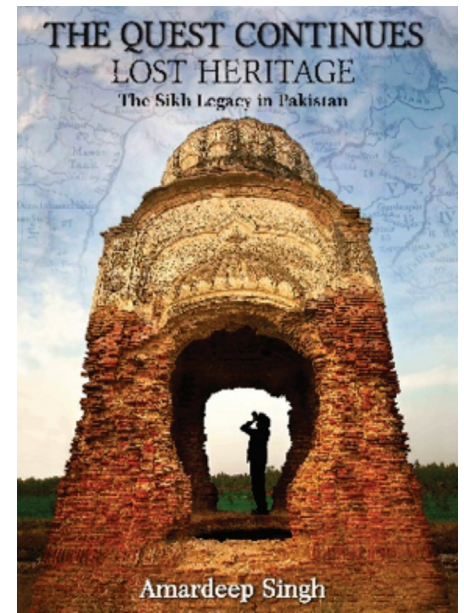

Led by a desire to connect with his ancestral lands, Amardeep Singh embarked on two epic journeys in 2014 across 36 cities, and in 2017 visited a further 90 locations – venturing across Pakistan Administered Kashmir, Sindh, Balochistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, and the Punjab. He documented this journey and its many discoveries in two large volumes (2016 and 2018, pictured above).

Amardeep Singh has lived in India, Hong Kong, and Singapore. He was educated at The Doon School, pursued electronics engineering at the Manipal Institute of Technology, and completed a Master of Business Administration at the University of Chicago. Though a high-level business executive for over two decades, his interest in history, photography, and literature grew into a project to recover a forgotten legacy of a heterogeneous culture and society that had once flourished in the very land sacrificed to give birth to two nations, Pakistan and India – the Punjab, the heart of the Sikh tradition.
